The SCC meeting for the odd semester started with a welcome address by the Chairperson, SCC. The Chairperson, in her address extended a warm welcome to the Heads of Departments and Schools, the faculty and the students present for the SCC meeting.

The Chairperson, SCC explained how the issues and concerns of the students were collected through a google form as Agenda Items by the office of the Dean, Students under different domains. The Chairperson, SCC further shared the agenda Items with all the members of SCC through presentation. All the agenda items raised by the students during the meeting were discussed and majority of them were satisfactorily addressed. Students present in the meeting were encouraged to ask questions over and above the agenda items as well.

Issues pertaining to Academic Affairs were answered by Dean, Academic Affairs. Other issues pertaining to activities about the departments/schools and hostels were clarified by the departmental heads and DOSA, Coordinating Warden/Wardens respectively.

A few of the agenda points deserved further discussion and action are listed as follows:

## **ISSUES RAISED BY THE STUDENTS AND THE ACTION POINTS**

#### **Issues related to Academic Affairs:**

Lack of good, experienced faculty in teaching computer related subjects in EIED department (102019021 - Gurpartap Singh Sidhu - EEC - UG 3rd Year)
 Action taken: (Head, EIED) The concerned faculty members have been counselled for improving their performance. They have been advised to clear all doubts of the students in computer related courses. Also, a meeting was held with the representatives of concerned batch where above-mentioned issues have been addressed, taking feedback from them regarding the improvement of the curriculum and ensuring the engagement of the faculty members with complete Computer Science background from the next semester.

- The speaking skills of most professors is not up to the standard of a university at the level of TIET. (102008045 Ishaan Singh Grewal MEE UG 3rd Year)
   Action taken: (Head, MED) We have conveyed the concern of the students to the faculty members of MED as well as to the TAs. Hopefully the the guidelines of teaching in English will be maintained in future in MED.
- Many students are complaining that most professors don't explain the concepts in the lectures properly and they rather just read and simply elaborate what is already written in their presentation (102117117 Kinshuk Kathpal COPC UG 2nd Year)
   Action taken: (Head, CSED) Since the student was not present in the SCC meeting, he was asked to contact in person or through the mail, and he said that the major issue was with the Operating System subject. The course coordinator of OS was called and asked to discuss with the concerned faculty member and the case has been thoroughly discussed and the faculty member has been advised to refrain from just reading the slides, instead, he should concentrate on teaching the concepts. Further this concern will be shared with all the faculty members of CSED.
- Many students had issues regarding Attendance

Action taken: (DoAA) Institute is in the process to streamline the attendance management. Attendance criteria of 75% is as per the regulator. No change in the regulation is admissible. We have carefully looked at all the course scheme, there is enough time to freely participate in co-curricular activities or for self-study. Students have a buffer of 25% attendance to participate in these activities. Moreover, TIET has 5 days teaching, Saturday and Sunday can also be used for such activities.

- Combined syllabus for EST's. (101904096 Kunal Choudhary EE UG 4th Year) Action taken: (DoAA) As per Academic regulation, EST will be held for the full syllabus of a particular course.
- The concepts that are taught in the class and the concepts asked in question paper are not of same level in almost all the subjects. The tutorial questions are of much lower level than the level of the questions asked in the examination markings are sometime quite different in COPC and COE i.e. in some subjects average of COE would be of 25 while of COPC would be of 15 which results in low grades for COPC as well. If it's a different branch then relative marking should be of particular branches. (102117138 Aditi Vij COPC UG 2nd Year)
   Action taken: (DoAA) As per Academic regulation all the branches which are registered for the same course will have a common grading. So, individual student has to work hard, irrespective of his/her branch to earn a good grade.
- The students request that sessionals be conducted along with ESTs, since a majority of them are busy preparing for placement tests and interviews and request that reading week be given for preparation of sessionals and ESTs and no quizzes be conducted during that period. (101917127 Shreya Somani COPC UG 4th Year)
- All evaluations/quizzes must be done under two weeks followed by exams as taking them over a whole month is mentally challenging for students. (102103234 Garv Chandalia COE UG 2nd Year)
- Quizzes to be held in the week before reading week. (101904096 Kunal Choudhary EE UG 4th Year)

Action taken: (DoAA) TIET follows a continuous evaluation pattern, so the sessional cannot be conducted along with EST which will defeat its purpose of continuous evaluations.

**Dean, Academics** office has sent an email to the faculty regarding faculty related issues and Heads are in sync with this process. Further, DoAA has also advised all the Hods/HoSs to offer mock training sessions for all final year students to prepare them for placement as being done by MED.

## Issues related to Heads of Departments/Schools

- No official help available from Department on Industrial training (302107005 Anshika Khandwal BCEM PG 2nd Year).
   Action Point: (HSCBC) For biochemistry students, HOS has already conveyed the same concern to Dr. Vijay Laxmi, School Coordinator to provide the data for the upcoming
- internships with company specific information.
  To gain more field work knowledge, each semester different site visits shall be planned for Civil Engineering students (102002012 - Arman Singh Shinh - CIE - UG 3rd Year).
  Action Point: (Representative of HCED) Dr. Tanuj Chopra conveyed that because of Covid restrictions the department was unable to send students; now efforts are being done to do organise official tours for the students.
- Schedule Extra LABS (DVD, FPGA, CAD) (602262017 Ritwik Yadav VD PG 1st Year) Action Point: (Representative of HECED) Dr. Anil Arora conveyed that already labs are available and are being conducted to facilitate student's needs.

## Issues related to LMS/Web-Kiosk/CITM:

- Many students raised the concern of Wi-Fi not working properly in the hostels Action Point: (HCITM)We are in the process of changing the Wi-Fi system, it's going to take at least 1-2 months to get it sorted as vendors are taking more time to send the equipment due to unavailability of silicon chips.
- Study material is not uploaded on LMS on time due to which the students face problem in revising the topics on time. Webkiosk does not work properly especially when results are declared. (102103186 Gunaayat Kaur COE UG 2nd Year) (102103447 Shreeya Chatterji COE UG 2nd Year)

Action Point: (HCITM) All the faculty members would be advised to upload the material as early as possible after the lectures but not before the lectures as students refrain from attending the classes when material is available. We encourage you to attend classes on regular basis. If material is not available kindly contact the course coordinators. Complete ERP system to mitigate the Webkisok related issues is to be implemented soon to facilitate the students. Meanwhile, we are shifting our computational work load to new server, which shall improve the performance of webkiosk.

## **Issues related to CILP/Placements:**

- More Biotechnology companies visiting campus for both Internships and Placements. (702000015 - Raghav Puri - BT - UG 3rd Year) (302201010 - Sanyogita Sharma - BT - PG 1st Year)(702000046 - Anvesha Bhardwaj - BT - UG 3rd Year)
- In none of the new companies that visit campus be it core electrical or computer, that our branch is mentioned and by the time we get it into the knowledge to getting our branch eligible just 1 day or just before few hours because of which many students are not able to apply for internships. (102019021 Gurpartap Singh Sidhu EEC UG 3rd Year)
- Very few companies have come for Internship for BE Mechanical currently in 3rd year, only a handful of companies have appeared and it is almost mid-November, students of other branches have already been placed in many companies, but we are still waiting. (102008045 Ishaan Singh Grewal MEE UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (HCILP) Internships are being handled by the respective departments. All the core companies for civil, mechanical is going to come in the second semester. Information shared is as per the company's schedule and information sharing. More companies pertaining to core Biotechnology profile are being contacted for campus placements.

• Many companies left the campus without any notice. Ex. Volvo, Jindal steel, Tata motors only took CSE students. (101904182 - Prakhar Pandey - ELE - UG 4th Year)

Action Point: (HCILP) Same company visits the campus twice or thrice a year and pick students of different background in each round. Next round may be for electrical or mechanical students.

Head CILP also advised all the students to attend placement related talks being conducted for the students to clarify their doubts during those sessions only.

## **Issues related to Extra-Curricular Activities:**

• Thapar never gives attendance concessions to any NCC cadet who is attending camps and representing his/her college at the state/national level. Even retests are not conducted if they miss any exam. (102015131 - Nitin Menon - ENC - UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (DoAA) Firstly exhaust 25% of attendance relief before asking for complete relaxation.

• There is no transportation facility provided unlike other institutes. (102015126 - Rudransh Arora - ENC - UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (DoSA) NCC students are advised to talk to Mr. Manpreet, NCC coordinator for the arrangement of transport facility, it can be arranged for NCC camps by the Institute.

### **Issues related to Extra-Curricular Activities:**

• Dues on the Webkiosk are showing up, we'd request to the finance department to reflect clearly about what the dues are for exactly. And even after multiple mails no receipt is received to a girl about her scholarship amount after the fee deduction. (302107005 - Anshika Khandwal - BCEM - PG 2nd Year)

Action Point: (FO) The dues shown on the webkiosk pertains to late fee payment charges of Rs. 5000/-. Her name is not in the scholarship list for the year 2021-22

• Students pursuing their PG thesis work off campus should be given some relaxation in final project semester fees since they won't be present on campus won't be using the resources of the department for their thesis work. (302101031 - Yukthi Dwivedi - BT - PG 2nd Year) Action Point: (FO) The fee has been calculated for the complete course not for individual semesters.

## **Issues related to Extra-Curricular Activities:**

- Requirement of a medical shop in campus. Many medicines are needed urgently and people cannot wait for the health center to order the medicine so that it comes in a few days. (102103447 Shreeya Chatterji COE UG 2nd Year)
- The dispensary opens up late on Sundays. This causes a lot of problems to sick students. (102118032 Vandita Arora COBS UG 2nd Year)
   Action Point: (Head, Health Centre) Already working with pharmaceuticals companies. 10am-2pm is a suitable time for all to visit dispensary on Sundays and doctors are always on call available in case of emergency.

## **Issues related to Hostels:**

- A basic first aid kit should be kept in all hostels. For example, ice packs in case of swelling, band aids, cotton roll, betadine etc. (102103368 Anhad Sharma COE UG 2nd Year)
   Action Point: (Coordinating Warden) Every hostel is having its first-aid kit since Covid as prescribed by the doctors of health centre. If certain items need to be added; incorporation of new items should be done through Student Executive Committee of every hostel.
- Please provide hostel accommodation to 1st year M.E-C.S.E boys in 2nd semester. (802232024 Kartik Chopra CSE PG 1st Year)

Action Point: (Coordinating Warden) Masters students are eligible to utilize the hostel services from January 2023 onwards.

• Few students had concerns regarding in-time at the main gate

Action Point: (DoSA) As of now, there will be no change in in time, these are for the safety of the students only.

• Evening snacks should be provided, milk atleast (102015126 - Rudransh Arora - ENC - UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (Coordinating Warden) If evening snacks are to added, additional charges are required to be paid in the mess fees or discussion can be done amongst mess committee to change menu for this adjustment.

## **Issues related to Library:**

• Books availability is a very big issue 2 Separate Sections must be made one for borrowing and other for just reading in the library. (102118069 - Arnav Sharma - COBS - UG 2nd Year)

Action Point: (Deputy Librarian) Maximum Books mentioned in the syllabus are available in our library. We cannot procure the books for all the students. If books are issued, students can hold/reserve them. The list of books mentioned in the Syllabus send to the HOD of each school and department for recommendation. Students can also recommend any books throughout the year. Recently, we circulated the 'Google Form' to students regarding book recommendations.

Central Library has four floors and has more than 1.15 books. Books available on the Ground, First and Second Floor can issue, whereas books available on the Third Level (Reference Books) cannot issue except books from the light reading collection.

• Please allow a 24-hour access and provision to library. (102019021 - Gurpartap Singh Sidhu - EEC - UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (Deputy Librarian) Library e-resources are available 24x7 across the globe. No login credentials is required to access these under TIET Network, whereas for off-campus access, login credentials are given to them. Further on the recommendation of higher authorities action can be taken.

• Majority of the plug points in the library don't work and there should be enough copies of some course related books. (102118032 - Vandita Arora - COBS - UG 2nd Year)

Action Point: (Deputy Librarian) We have already sent an email to CMS people on 11-11-2022 regarding it and requested them to depute one person to check, repair, and replace it (in case of not repairable). We are in touch with CMS People.

## **Issues related to CMS:**

- Shortage of hand wash in washrooms. Very Few charging points in B block. (302101031 -Yukthi Dwivedi - BT - PG 2nd Year) Unavailability of charging sockets in TAN rooms (102103314 - Raghav Mittal - COE - UG 2nd Year) (102103217 - Kheman Mittal - COE -UG 2nd Year)
- LP-110 class room must be renovated with proper seating many times writing pad is also not there instead of that a white board is there that is not visible properly to person sitting in the last row. (102118069 Arnav Sharma COBS UG 2nd Year)

• Rooms of E Block and F Block are very poorly planned the fans are placed on top of the aisles, making classes in the summers extremely tough, no attention has been paid to acoustics either, it is tough to understand what professors are saying sitting towards the far end of the classrooms. (102008045 - Ishaan Singh Grewal - MEE - UG 3rd Year)

Action Point: (Head, Project and Estate) There are already 3 wash basins in Female toilet and 2 wash basins in male Toilets and no space for additional wash basins is available. Feasibility for fixing Charging points in Class rooms of B-Block/TAN is being checked and will be provided where possible.

Old furniture has been placed in LP-110 in place of new furniture for examination by DOAA. F-Block is being modified completely by August 2023. Acoustics treatment of E-Block will be taken up shortly.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks by the Chairperson. She further stated that in future it would be mandatory for SCC members to attend the meeting especially if they have raised any concern.

The SCC meeting for the even semester started with a welcome address by the Chairperson, SCC. The Chairperson, in her address extended a warm welcome to the Heads of Departments and Schools, the faculty and the students present for the SCC meeting.

The Chairperson, SCC explained how the issues and concerns of the students were collected through a google form as Agenda Items by the office of the Dean, Students under different domains. The Chairperson, SCC further shared the agenda Items with all the members of SCC through presentation. All the agenda items raised by the students during the meeting were discussed and majority of them were satisfactorily addressed. Students present in the meeting were encouraged to ask questions over and above the agenda items as well.

The Chairperson also highlighted some of the important steps Institute has taken to ensure safety and security of students on TIET campus and the progress made is detailed as under:

- Face recognition system has been installed at the main entrance to ensure the safety and security of all of the students. An SMS is sent to the parents at 8 PM incase a student doesn't report back to the Institute till that time.
- The facilities at the health center are now open from 8:30 a.m. to 2 a.m. in three shifts. A new Doctor has been appointed for night shift.
- > A physiotherapy center is also functional in the health center.
- Biometric attendance during the night in all the hostels along with mock fire drills have been reinstated.
- Scholarships include merit, merit cum means, and full fee waivers (in case of death of earning member) of about 29 Crores have been distributed to the students under different categories as stated.
- New Facilities: Nirvana Park, a new sports complex, a pharmacy, and a feedback system are among the upcoming facilities.

Further the issues mentioned in the Agenda items were taken up starting with Academics.

Issues pertaining to Academic Affairs were replied by Dean, Academic Affairs. Other issues pertaining to activities about the departments/schools and hostels were clarified by the departmental heads and Coordinating Warden/Wardens respectively.

#### ISSUES RAISED BY THE STUDENTS AND THE ACTION POINTS

#### **Issues related to Academic Affairs:**

**Student's Concern:** There is no AC in B-Block classrooms due to which students feel uncomfortable while attending classes during summers. So AC/Coolers should be installed there. (102006172 - Harsh Raj - ECE - UG 3rd Year). Air conditioned classrooms for ECED department students. (102015126 - Rudransh Arora - ENC - UG 3rd Year)

Student's Concern: Classes are very small and due to heat it is very difficult to sit in the class. (102005111 - Sparsh kansal - EIC - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

The administration is actively working on the refurbishment plan of old block(s). This semester F block is being refurbished and other blocks shall follow this progression.

**Student's Concern:** We are not taught MATLAB from the very basics and it's getting difficult for us to do MATLAB coding. Most of our work in thesis is to be done in MATLAB. So it will a great help if this pattern of providing code to students get change and make students able to understand coding and algorithms from depth. (302108011 - Kanika Narang - MATHS - PG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

It can be challenging to work on MATLAB coding without proper knowledge of the basics, especially when a significant portion of student's thesis work involves it. The faculty members responsible for teaching MATLAB will be informed about student's feedback. In the meantime, we encourage student/s to seek help from their professors or teaching assistants if they are facing any difficulties with MATLAB. Tutors are always available to provide additional support and clarify any doubts that students may have.

**Student's Concern:** Google cloud storage to be increased or google classroom and forms should be open to all mail id's because students are not able to submit resumes, lab assignments due to the drive storage issues and the admin controls are allowed only to the Thapar Organization which prevents many students from submitting their resumes or lab assignments in the forms or classroom. (102017090 - Sai Lohitaksh Reddy D - CSE - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

Although, Thapar Institute has purchased 200TB of extra storage for catering to the said concern, but students should also understand their responsibility for not storing unnecessary material like movies, songs, personal backups at this cloud storage area. Right now, approximately 15 GB per student is available for their usage.

Student's Concern: Many in our class complaint regarding continuous evaluation system (it can be more compact). (102103080 - Yessica Tuteja - COE - UG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

We are committed to providing an effective and fair evaluation system that benefits all students in the class. Only after reviewing the evaluation system that was in practice, the scenario for continuous evaluation has been brought in so that student should not feel overburdened in last one or two weeks.

Student's Concern: Relaxation in attendance criteria (exclusion of sick leaves from 25% absents) (101902123 - Mehak Sharma - CIE - UG 4th Year)

Student's Concern: Attendance Criteria. (102117076 - Aadeshvir Singh - COPC - UG 2nd Year)

**Student's Concern:** Please reduce attendance criteria to 60% for pre-final and final year students as we don't get much time for studying for placements. (102005106 - Rishabh raj - BE - UG 3rd Year)

**Student's Concern:** With our project semester starting in 2 months, we have 7 subjects, ELCs, Capstone along with evaluations in every two weeks which makes this whole semester very hectic. The problem that we encounter is that it becomes very difficult to balance everything at once. Reasons stated also makes it difficult to maintain attendance criteria. A leverage in the same would be appreciated. (702000015 - Raghav Puri - BT - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

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We understand that students are facing challenges in balancing attendance requirements and preparation for placement exams. We appreciate their feedback and understand the importance of preparing for placement exams. However, attendance is an essential component of academic performance, and we cannot compromise on the standards set by the regulatory bodies.

**Student's Concern:** Now we are in last semester of 3rd year. We are not getting enough time to study for placements. I think it is right time to not give attendance our major criteria. (102199008 - Divyang Pandoh - EEC - UG 3rd Year)

#### Action Point (DOAA):

I understand that this is a critical time for you and your future career prospects, and it is essential to focus on your job search. However, attendance is an important aspect of your academic performance and is usually a mandatory requirement. It helps you to stay on track with your coursework, interact with your professors, and collaborate with your peers. It also reflects your dedication towards your education and future career. However, attendance is an essential component of academic performance, and we cannot compromise on the standards set by the regulatory bodies

Student's Concern: There is a need for 5-10 minutes break between lectures. The classes start around 8 and after continuous sitting of 4-5 hours, students are out of energy to concentrate. (102103376 - Deepanshi Sharma - COE - UG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

We appreciate the feedback, and we assure you that we take it seriously. We will review the schedule to see if there is a way to incorporate breaks between classes to help students recharge and maintain focus.

Student's Concern: Conducting of the lab evaluations separately i.e. on one day we have performance and on some other day we again need to study for viva. This is becoming difficult, so if we can take some positive steps towards this. (102003735 - Manmeet Singh - COE - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

It is important to note that the scheduling of evaluations is based on various factors, including the availability of resources and faculty members. Segregating lab into further components provides an ample time to students to prepare for it.

**Student's Concern:** The class of EIC 3rd year is scheduled in E-205, supposedly a tutorial class, the accommodation of whole lecture group in such a small classroom is torturous, 4 students are accommodating on a single bench in non AC classroom during peak summer season. It's a request to kindly shift us on the ground floor classroom of E-Block or reduce the attendance criteria. Attending classes in such a manner is frustrating and disappointing on everyday basis, indirectly affecting our learning experience and capacity. (102005018 - Amisha Guru - EIC - UG 3rd Year)

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#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

We will try our best to make arrangements to shift the class to a more spacious and comfortable classroom.

Student's Concern: Sessional to be held with/near MSTs/ESTs. Not in middle of academically relaxed period. (102104085 - Pushpak Goel - EE - UG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

It is important to note that the scheduling of evaluations is based on various factors, including the availability of resources and faculty members. In the start of current academic session, a detailed schedule mentioning all the evaluation dates for particular subjects had already been floated.

**Student's Concern:** The marks distribution in the maximum number of MST papers is not being done according to time available during paper. The teachers are trying to ask every topic which is a part of syllabus. This leads to lengthy questions with a small weightage and limited time. Not only this, teachers don't take into account this fact during checking/evaluation of answer sheets. After giving the MST, many of my classmates felt that the questions made by individual faculties have been just assembled without taking into consideration the total time available/weightage of the exam. #### Action Point (DOAA):

We would like to assure student/s that we take all feedback seriously and are constantly striving to improve the assessment process. We will bring the said concern to the attention of faculty members and work towards finding a suitable solution. In the meantime, we suggest that student/s reach out to respective/individual faculty members and express concern regarding the time available and weightage of the exam. They may be able to provide further clarification and guidance on how to approach the exam.

**Student's Concern:** Removal of attendance criteria for those with good CGPA. We have to attend classes for attendance but usually have to end up studying and understanding the whole topic by ourselves only. Spending the whole day till 5 in the evening not understanding anything in lectures doesn't leave enough time to understand the topics and for extra studies later. (102103276 - Moyukh Biswas - COE - UG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

We understand that attending classes can be challenging, especially when the topics covered may not be fully understood during the lecture. Attendance is an important factor in ensuring that students benefit from the educational experience. 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We encourage you to make a study plan that prioritizes the topics covered in both exams. Additionally, attending classes regularly and actively participating in class can help in retaining the concepts covered in the MST syllabus, making it easier to prepare for the EST. This concern cannot be accommodated or worked upon.

Student's Concern: Take one lab evaluation and one sessional in semester as earlier. (102005106 - Rishabh raj - BE - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

**Student's Concern:** While Writing exams during last 5 or 6 min sometimes it appears that we will not be needing any supplementary sheet but as the time proceeds i.e. 3 or 4 mins are left due to some error we need to strike some part of the answer and mostly it is on the last page of the main answer booklet and we are left with no space on the main booklet to complete 7 or 8 line in last 4 mins because left over supplementary sheets from the invigilator are taken away 5 minutes before the conclusion of that exam. #### Action Point (DOAA):

We will bring this concern to the attention of the examination department for further consideration.

**Student's Concern:** Relaxation in files maintaining by allowing printed experiments in labs, to reduced extra pressure on students. (102104085 - Pushpak Goel - EE - UG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

However, we may not be able to relax the requirement of maintaining files completely. We will work towards finding a solution that benefits all our students.

**Student's Concern:** MSc. Mathematics and Computing students facing issue with the teachers of their computing subjects as they feel that teachers from computer department don't put much effort in many topics and coding. (302108011 - Kanika Narang - MATHS - PG 2nd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

We take the quality of education very seriously, and we will bring student's concern to the attention of the concerned faculty members. We will work towards finding a solution that ensures the quality of education and meets the expectations of our students.

Student's Concern: The Syllabus for some subjects is too much and it is difficult to complete it with 7 subjects in hand. (102005001 - Sarthak Kapila - EIC - UG 3rd Year)

#### **Action Point (DOAA):**

It is important to note that the syllabus of each subject is designed to ensure comprehensive coverage of the topic and to meet the academic standards of the course. The syllabus is reviewed regularly to ensure that it remains relevant and up-to-date. We encourage student(s) to manage time effectively, prioritize workload, and create a study plan that suits one's needs. Air conditioning can help regulate temperature and humidity in a table tennis hall, improving gameplay by reducing hindrance from unpredictable ball movement caused by fans' airflow. Action Point (Deputy Director Sports): A new sports complex is forthcoming.

#### **ISSUES RELATED TO OTHERS**

**Student's Concern:** We understand that entry/exit apart from main gate should be restricted. But keeping in mind the fact that fruit market is really close to the R&D Gate and students may need to purchase fruits, entry/exit for at least 1-2 hours should be allowed from R&D gate. For example: For 4-6 PM, students can be allowed entry and exit from R&D Gate after showing Valid Institute ID card to the guards over there. We usually have classes till 5 PM every evening and with the present campus In-time it gets impossible to get out of campus after classes. Most of college students study till late nights and it gets suffocating being stuck inside the hostel just since 8.30 PM in the evening. Action Point (DoSA): The main entry time has been extended to 8 PM. And by 8PM all the students need to return back to the Institute main gate.

**Student's Concern:** The security guards at main gate are very rude, even if they know something is right, they don't allow us to so, instead they tell ask the higher authorities, which is very difficult at that particular time. They are non-cooperative. Even if a student reaches the main gate 7:02 pm at the evening, they deny the access to go out. It might be an emergency in some cases. Action Point (Head Administration): We've previously designated checkpoints for each hostel in the appropriate delivery zone. There are already red and green zones for everyone to abide by. Delivery time remains the same as of now. **Student's Concern:** Currently the number of water coolers is less on campus and some taps of them don't even work. Kindly ensure an adequate number of water coolers are available and they are regularly cleaned to provide students and staff with clean drinking water.
