

## Thapar Student Medical Claim

Thapar Institute of Engineering & Technology (TIET) provides a **Medical Claim Facility** to support students' healthcare needs and reduce the financial stress of medical emergencies. This facility offers reimbursement of medical expenses incurred due to illness, accidents, or hospitalization, subject to the institute's guidelines.

### Objective

The scheme reflects TIET's commitment to student welfare by:

- Providing financial relief during medical emergencies.
- Ensuring access to quality healthcare services.
- Promoting a safe and supportive campus life for all students.

### Eligibility

- All full-time enrolled students of TIET are eligible.
- Coverage is applicable throughout the duration of enrolment.

### Scope of Coverage

- **Outpatient Expenses:** Consultation fees, diagnostic tests, prescribed medicines, doctor's fees, nursing charges, and medical procedures.
- **Emergency Care:** Immediate treatment required due to accidents or sudden illness.

### Reimbursement Amount

- **Up to ₹2,000 per student per academic year** for medical expenses, subject to submission of **valid original bills and documents**.

### Claim Procedure

1. **Initial Consultation** – Report to the TIET Health Centre for treatment or referral.
2. **Referral/Approval** – Obtain referral slip for treatment outside campus (unless emergency).
3. **Collect Documents** – Preserve original bills, prescriptions, diagnostic reports, discharge summaries, and referral notes.
4. **Submit Claim** – Fill the claim form and attach all documents. Submit to DoSA/Health Centre within **15 days** of treatment/discharge.
5. **Verification & Approval** – Claims are reviewed by the Medical Committee; approved expenses are reimbursed via student's bank account.

### Exclusions

- Cosmetic/elective treatments not related to medical necessity.
- Non-prescription/over-the-counter items.
- Dental or vision treatments (unless emergency/accidental).
- Treatments without Health Centre referral (except genuine emergencies).
